REPRESENTATIVE MATTERS

- **Song v. Lee (In re Lee),** 2015 Bankr. LEXIS 2130. Defended corporation and its shareholders in fraud and corporate claims in a jury trial from former shareholder to defense verdict and award of client's attorney's fees in the bankruptcy court.
- In re Liberty Asset Mgmt. Corp., 2019 Bankr. LEXIS 48. Obtained award of \$2,000,000 from bankruptcy court based on clients' investment in real estate project.
- Ramos v. Ramos, 691 Fed. Appx. 487. Prevailed in appeal of motion to dismiss plaintiff's claims in federal court of breach of fiduciary duty and fraud.
- **Shahedi v. Trimble,** 2015 Cal.App.Unpub. LEXIS 2136. Successfully overturned judgment on appeal of individual owner of corporation after trial court issued order holding owner liable for the debts of the corporation.
